Item #	Descriptions of Flowers Offered	(see order form)
01	Daffodil ‘Dutch Master’ - Excellent for landscaping jobs, great for pollinators, and it is fragrant! This plant is tolerant of droughts, deer, and rodents. Blooms in April. Height: 18 inches. Zone 3-9.	
02	Narcissus Butterfly ‘Orangery’ - This fragrant daffodil is great for pollinators and has striking ruffled flowers. It is tolerant of deer and rodents. Blooms in early-mid spring. Height: 14 inches. Zone 4-8.	
03	Narcissus Long-Lasting ‘Fragrant Mixture’ - Designed for mass planting, these bulbs produce a large amount of daffodils that have a lengthy bloom time. These flowers are fragrant, pollinator friendly, and tolerant of deer and rodents. Blooms in early-late spring. Height: 16 inches. Zone: 3-8.	
04	Narcissus Large Cupped ‘Flower Record’ - Excellent for mass plantings and are very fragrant. They have strong stems and flowers that withstand cold, wet, and windy weather conditions. These plants are deer, rodent, and rabbit resistant. Blooms in early-mid spring. Height: 18 inches. Zone: 3-8.	
05	Mini Allium ‘Triquetrum’ - Great for naturalizing if planted in rich, well-drained soil. Great plants for pollinators, and their scent will keep away deer, rodents, and rabbits. This bulb offers a wide array of flower sizes, shapes, and color. Blooms in late spring-early summer. Height: 20 inches. Zones 4-7.	
06	Hyacinth ‘Sweet Invitation’ - These peach colored flowers smell just as sweet as fruit! Flowers are dramatic bloomers, upright green foliage frames these vertical flower clusters. Great for pollinators and are ignored by deer and rodents. Blooms in early spring. Height: 10 inches. Zones: 4-9.	
07	Hyacinth ‘Blue Star’ - Excellent for naturalizing if planted in rich, well-drained soil. Amazing for pollinators. Very fragrant, resistant to deer, rabbit, and rodents. Blooms early-mid spring. Height: 10 inches. Zones: 4-8.	
08	Large Flowering Crocus Mixture - Great naturalizers and come in a sea of lavender, yellow, white, and purple. They are deer resistant, attract pollinators, and bloom in April. Height: 5 inches Zones: 4-8.	
09	Crocus Chrysanthus ‘Panda’ - These bulbs are high in contrast with their dark purple, almost black coloration, and their yellow-white coloration. These flowers have smooth, beautiful petals. Blooms in late March-early April. Height: 4 inches. Zones: 4-8.	
10	Darwin Hybrid Tulip ‘World Peace’ - Excellent for landscaping and produces excellent egg-shaped blooms. These are the tallest tulips and withstand the windiest, rainiest, spring

weather. They are also very fragrant and great for pollinators. Blooms in mid-late spring.
Height: 24 inches. Zones: 3-8.

11 Triumph Tulip 'Bojangles'- Excellent for mass plantings with the largest and most stunning assortment of colors. The flowers are angular-petaled on sturdy stems, are fragrant, and great for pollinators. Blooms in mid-Spring.
Height: 18 inches. Zones: 3-8.

12 Lily Flowering Tulip 'Ballerina'- These flowers are very fragrant and known to be elegant. They have a unique shape, with their petals pointed and often re-curving. They sit on a thin stem, so they should be planted in a more sheltered area with less wind. Flowers are attractive and vibrant. Bloom in late spring.
Height: 18 inches. Zones: 3-8.

13 Single Early Tulip 'Mystic Prince'- Deep violet purple flower with silky texture. Requires partial shade and well-drained soil. Generally resistant to most pests and diseases but can be susceptible to tulip fire and bulb rot in poorly drained soils. Blooms in early to mid-spring.
Height: 14 inches. Zones: 3-7.

14 Single Late Tulip 'Sorbet'- Features a delightful mix of colors, with petals displaying shades of pink, white, and sometimes a touch of yellow. Full sun to partial shade. Well-drained soil is essential. Resistant to most pests and diseases. Blooms in late spring.
Height: 24 inches. Zones: 3-7.

15 Grape Hyacinth (Muscari) 'Armeniacum'-Features spikes of deep blue to violet-blue flowers. Can create a dense carpet. A great pollinator. Fragrant. Blooms early to mid-spring.
Height: 6-8 inches. Zones: 4-8.

16 Grape Hyacinth (Muscari) 'Pink Sunrise'- Features delicate, pale pink flowers. Attracts pollinators especially bees. Plants well with daffodils. Fragrant. Blooms in mid-spring.
Height: 6-8 inches. Zones: 4-8.

14 Blue & Purple Hill Rock Iris Mixture- Features stunning blue and purple flowers. Attracts a variety of pollinators. Early naturalizers. Good for forcing. Blooms in early to mid-spring.
Height: 4-8 inches. Zones: 3-9.

18 Eranthus 'Winter Aconite'- Features bright yellow, cup-shaped flowers. Generally resistant to most pests and diseases. Long, winter blooming displays. Highly attractive to pollinators such as bees. Poisonous if ingested. Blooms very early spring, before crocuses.
Height: 3-4 inches. Zones: 2-8.

19 Anemone Blanda Mix- Features daisy-like flowers in a variety of colors. Attractive to pollinators, particularly bees. great for borders, rock gardens, pots and containers and for groundcover under taller Tulips and Daffodils. Blooms early to mid-spring.
Height: 6-8 inches. Zones: 5-9.

20 Giant Snowflake (Leucojum 'Gravity Giant')- Features large, white flowers with green tips on each petal. Good for planting under deciduous trees. Blooms mid-late spring.

Height: 20-25 inches. Zones: 4-8.

21 Giant Allium 'Universe'- With colossal flower heads measuring 8½" across, these celestial spheres of violet-purple florets atop sturdy stems create a spectacle in your yard. Attract pollinators such as bees and butterflies. Blooms in late spring to early summer.

Height: 36-48 inches. Zones: 4-8.

22 Bearded Iris 'Presby's Crown Jewel'- Rebloomer. Features large, showy blooms with a striking color combination. Should be planted just below the soil surface, with the top of the rhizome exposed to the air and 12-18 inches apart. Attracts pollinators such as bees and butterflies. Blooms in mid to late spring, usually in May.

Height: 24-30 inches. Zones: 3-9.

23 Fritillaria Imperialis 'Persica'- Features striking, bell-shaped flowers that are typically a deep, rich purple or burgundy. Attract pollinators such as bees and butterflies. Blooms in mid to late spring.

Height: 24-36 inches. Zones: 5-9.

24 Garlic "German Extra Hardy" - The most reliable garlic to grow. This exceptionally cold-hardy, hardneck porcelain variety produces large heads with 5-8 large cloves each. Cures well for long storage. Classic garlic taste.

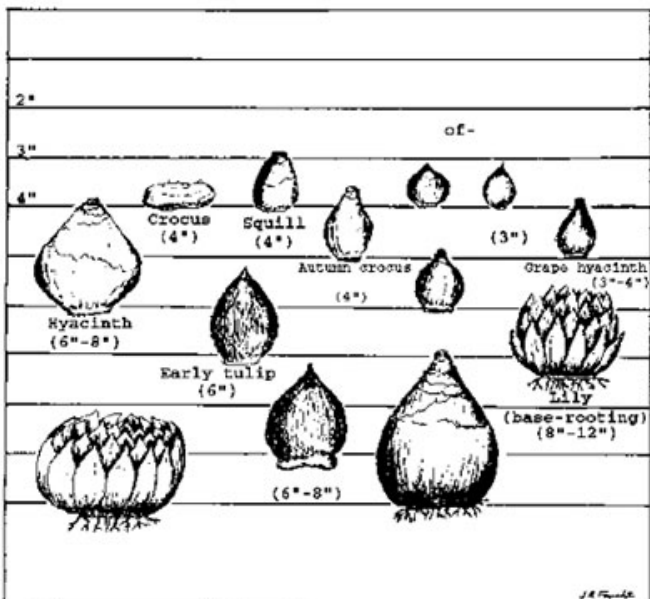


Figure 1: Bulb planting chart. (Numbers in parentheses refer to minimum spacing.) Lilies normally are planted in the spring, while autumn crocuses normally are planted in midsummer. All other bulbs shown are planted in the fall. Planting depths are for well-drained soils. Bulbs do best in a sandy, clay loam. In heavier soils, plant 1 to 2 inches higher.
